
Carham Parish Council Newsletter



Free Trees

Northumberland County Council's offer of a free tree for every household was so successful when it was launched that all of the 15,000 available trees were ordered within a matter of days. The Council has said that it will take contact details for anyone who missed out and will give them priority when the scheme is repeated next year. If you do not have anywhere to plant a tree you will be offered a small cell grown shrub which you can plant in a container. Packs of trees are available for schools and community groups. Carham Parish Council is an elected body in the first tier of local government. It is responsible for representing the interests of the whole community. Among other things, it is concerned with community safety, street lighting, common land, play areas, litter, tourism, traffic calming, seats and shelters, rights of way, and some aspects of planning and highways.

The Parish Council meets six times a year. Meetings are in alternate months beginning in May, on the second Tuesday of the month, in St Cuthbert's Church, Carham at 6.30pm. Anyone living or working in the parish can attend a meeting.
